The policy forum is addressed mainly to Mediterranean, national, regional and local policy makers and key stakeholders involved in wild food value chains (including associations of producers, harvesters and processors, consumer, organisations, industries, NGO, Public institutions...). Main output of the policy forum will be a document, called "policy notes"¹, that will be promoted among main national and European institutions.
